Overview of the Workshop Programme

Developing the following understandings:

- Our personal cultural identities influences who we are as teachers.
- International-mindedness is not about 'the other' but rather about understanding the self.
- The curriculum framework can provide opportunities for learning about issue that have personal, local and global relevance and significance.
- An inclusive ethos which values and reflects the diversity of cultures and perspectives within and beyond the school community can be developed and supported.
- Internationally minded learners could actively demonstrate responsibility for and commitment to making a difference in the world.
